

Addendum to the Statement of Common Ground between the London Borough of Camden and Haringey

December 2025

Introduction

This is an addendum to the Statement of Common Ground signed by the London Borough of Camden and London Borough of Haringey on 19 September 2025.

In London, planning and co-operation on strategic matters, to be addressed through compliance with the duty to co-operate, are generally covered by the London Plan, with more locally specific matters covered in local plans. Camden and Haringey both actively engage on the preparation of the London Plan. The London Plan is part of the development plan for all planning authorities in London and Local Plans prepared by London boroughs are required to be in general conformity with it.

Given this, it is considered that the main strategic matters to be addressed through the Duty to Cooperate for the London Borough Camden and the London Borough Haringey are:

- housing need
- meeting the accommodation needs of Gypsies and Travellers
- tall buildings.

Waste is also considered to be a strategic matter for both boroughs and Camden and Haringey co-operated on this matter as part of the preparation of the North London Waste Plan (NLWP), which was adopted in 2022. The NLWP sets out the planning framework for waste management in the boroughs up to 2037.

The London Borough of Camden has engaged with the London Borough of Haringey in an appropriate, proportionate and effective manner throughout the preparation of the Local Plan, providing an opportunity for strategic matters to be discussed, and concerns in relation to the Plan to be addressed. Appendix 1 sets out agendas and notes of duty to co-operate meetings held between the boroughs since 2019.

The London Borough of Haringey are satisfied that the Duty to Co-operate has been met in relation to the preparation of the Camden Local Plan and there are no unresolved matters between the two boroughs.

Signatures

Both parties agree that this Statement is an accurate representation of matters discussed and issues agreed upon. We confirm that the information in this Statement of Common Ground reflects the joint working to address identified strategic matters that has been undertaken between the London Boroughs of Camden and Haringey. The authorities will continue to work collaboratively to address cross-boundary issues and to meet the duty to cooperate.

Camden – Haringey Duty to Co-operate Meeting 2 August 2018

1. Update on Local Plans

Camden

- Local Plan adopted 2017
- SPD review – 2 phases, 1 complete, 2nd phase consultation expected in Autumn
- Site Allocations review – call for sites Jan / Feb 2018

Haringey

- Have taken all DPD reviews through to adoption already, now on Wood Green AAP – the numbers will likely be lower due to uncertainty on Crossrail 2 – will now proceed just assuming Piccadilly upgrade – there is no news on progress between TfL and Treasury on Crossrail 2 funding
- There was a new Wood Green preferred options consultation earlier this year, some permissions on allocated sites already - reg 19 consult will be late 2018
- SPD also largely updated

2. London Plan - overall housing need and target

Haringey

- London Plan housing target up from 800 to 1,500. Have not set a local need target
- Around 1,300 on the national test due to relative affordability of east of borough
- Haringey will now need 20% buffer
- Delivery is an issue - e.g. one 1,500 homes site wants 11 years to complete
- 111 site allocations in plans
- Hackney have asked Haringey whether some of Hackney's needs can be met in Haringey, Haringey have said no as Hackney are not making the best of their own land
- Haringey's main London Plan objection was on small site target – 660 pa for Haringey – which conflicts with the borough's strategy of targeting growth.
- Camden's main London Plan issues are its level of detail / relationship with borough local plans and the new traveller definition

3. NPPF

Housing delivery test

- both boroughs will need an action plan

- **Camden** will likely be close to 85% on HDT, which would trigger the requirement for a 20% buffer, which would be challenging
- **Haringey** will be around 50% on HDT
- **Affordable Housing definitions** – affordable home ownership and intermediate rent

Statements of common ground

- Haringey have not been asked to contribute by another borough - the main thing would be housing or big ticket infrastructure
- Barnet might be coming forward with a new plan quite soon, so a request might come from them
- Westminster have advised Camden that they intend to initiate one, but nothing has appeared as yet

4. Housing matters

- Haringey has big problems with temporary accommodation – local rent rises mean lots of households presenting as homelessness. Local rental market is too expensive for Haringey to use as temporary accommodation, so they are having to look at accommodation elsewhere.

Affordable Housing need

- Haringey have an affordable target 40% across borough, based on viability. Need significantly outstrips supply
- Numerical need around 56% of overall need
- Plan has 60% - 40% split

Gypsy and Travellers

- Haringey failed to persuade local plan inspector to accept a mixed-community policy that would have required developers to include pitches
- Haringey have a shortfall of 8 pitches and another 2 needed in the short-term
- There is a new post-2015 travellers needs assessment, but it has not signed off.
- Camden is looking to potentially use Council owned sites identified for disposal to meet some of their need.

Self Build

- Haringey currently have a 1-part register hosted by EcoMotive, but plan to leave soon
- Currently have 1-part register, around 400 entries, very few with Haringey as first preference
- Camden also had EcoMotive hosting, but parted from them after the first 6 months. Have almost 500 on register. Moving to a 2-part register with a fee
- Have a local residency test and a financial resources test.

Other specialist housing needs

- Haringey have a DPD policy on housing for older people – trying to capture an affordable element from private retirement homes market.
- Haringey has not seen much speculative interest in student housing lately, only connected with HE institutions
- Haringey also have not had pressure for compact living schemes. There is a warehouse living district which seems to meet this type of demand.

Empty homes

- For Haringey there has not really a build-to-leave empty issue, and no interest in promoting local marketing first

5. Neighbourhood Plans

- Camden has three made plans - Fortune Green & West Hampstead, Kentish Town and Highgate. Hampstead has passed referendum and will be made in October.
- No Forums have asked for apportionment of housing to date.
- Finsbury Park would be a tri-borough NP with Islington and Hackney
- Haringey are working with Highgate Neighbourhood Forum on local CIL spend

6. Article 4 Directions

- Haringey's main issue is loss of industry – so have protected main industrial estates
- Camden have confirmed article 4s for A1 to A2, B1c to C3, and laundrettes. Expect to confirm B1a to C3 in the CAZ later this year.

7. Any other cross border strategic matter?

- For Haringey, Highgate School is the only major site coming up near the Camden boundary – school reconfiguration/ extension within MOL
- Camden has Highgate Newtown Community Centre

1. Update on Local Plans

Camden

- Local Plan adopted 2017
- SPD updated 2018-19
- Site Allocations review – draft going to Cabinet Nov 2019. The largest allocations are mostly on industrial-type sites, some issues with GLA on content for these.
- Ongoing work on planning frameworks for Growth Areas.

Haringey

- Local Plan adopted 2017, new administration seeking a new plan
- 'Issues an options' expected early 2020, aiming to adopt pre-elections early 2022.
- Priorities around affordable housing, tenure preferences, London Plan targets, climate change, industrial land.
- Rolling programme of AAPs and Site Allocations.
- Wood Green AAP progressed to Reg 18.

North London Waste Plan

- Haringey are in discussions with NLWP programme manager re. Pinkham Way.
- It is anticipated that the Inspector will recommend mods.

SPD cross-border issues

- Haringey are producing a masterplanning approach for Highgate School based on the site allocation. They will consult LB Camden.
- Some concern about increasing student numbers.
- Requirement for some building on MoL, in discussion with GLA.

2. NPPF

- Feb 2019 update includes some changes to the definition of deliverable, the two criteria are stricter, but a site only needs to meet one of them
- 5-year land supply - Haringey already have a 20% buffer factored in. Have produced a new AMR for evidence.
- HDT - both boroughs have relatively low housing delivery for 2018-19, around 568 for Haringey. Emerging figure for Camden is c670 (which would likely mean a score below 80%) but this could increase with further work on monitoring of completions

- Haringey have an Action Plan already.
- SoCG – both boroughs have completed a SoCG with Islington, but no others.
- Westminster attempted to produce a multi-party Statement but has had objections.

3. London Plan

- Boroughs understand the Panel's report has not been received yet.
- On receipt there will be an 8 week interval before publication

4. Housing

Gypsies and Travellers

- Haringey's pre 2015 study showed a need for 4 pitches, while the London Plan (based on 2008 London GTANA) suggests 32.
- Camden 2014 study showed a need for 16 pitches.

Self-build

- Haringey have approved a 2-part register with a fee and residency test. Currently c260 people registered
- Camden - following introduction of a fee, only one person is on the register

Empty homes

- Camden – the number of homes empty above 6-months fluctuates, but has been rising and affects housing delivery figures.
- Haringey – only monitor on the basis of homes brought back into use.

5. Neighbourhood Planning

Haringey

- Highgate – little planning policy contact with Forum since plan adopted
- Crouch Hill – one meeting with Forum
- Finsbury Park and Stroud Green – little contact with Forum

Camden

- fifth Neighbourhood Plan has passed examination – Dartmouth Park. To be adopted next year following referendum
- Neighbourhood Plan emerging for Camley Street. Forum includes local industrial businesses

6. Article 4

- Haringey focus is Conservation Area Article 4s
- Camden is extending the Article 4 restricting B1c to C3 to cover more locations.

7. CIL

- Haringey are Looking at increasing the CIL for residential uses in the eastern area.
- Also trying to work out if they can index existing CIL rates to the same point – otherwise they will be indexing different rates from a different base year
- Looking at involvement of Neighbourhood Forums in local spending, allowing them to nominate projects for the borough to take forward
- Camden are also looking at a limited CIL review to increase rates in Central London.
- Local spending is ward-based and member-led

8. Any other cross boundary issues.

- Discussion of TfL's proposed cycle route between Tottenham Hale and Camden.

Haringey and Camden Duty-to-Cooperate Meeting

23 April 2021

1. Update on Local Plans

- Camden Draft Site Allocations Local Plan (SALP) features approx. 85 sites: 40+ detailed allocations, the rest are 'list sites' giving preferred uses and net housing capacities only.
- Reg 18 consultation took place Feb - April 2020. There was a pause to take stock of planning reform proposals but now progressing Reg 19 draft to Cabinet / Council in Summer.
- Haringey's Issues and options consultation on a new Local Plan started in November 2020.
- Will encompass the Tottenham AAP (adopted) and Wood Green AAP.
- Looking at new Growth Area around Haringay Green Lanes station – Sainsbury's redevelopment, St Ann's Hospital.
- Have used Commonplace and used Teams for issue-based discussions. Commonplace tended to focus people on open space, roads, landmarks.
- Doing study of employment needs and land availability: speaking to occupiers, looking at clusters, what types/formats are working etc.
- Undertaking comprehensive SINC review across the borough - consultant working with GiGL. Will also involve ecology net-gain calculations. New SINC's being proposed in Tottenham Hale area. Also, work is identifying priority management plans, e.g. Highgate Queens Wood.
- Have also commissioned:
 - Retail and Employment Land Needs – out for tender
 - Archaeological Priority Areas Assessment
 - SFRA update
 - Whole plan viability assessment
- Are progressing an in-house characterisation study and small-sites capacity assessment (using sketch up).

2. London Plan

- Neither borough had any discussion points.

3. Planning reforms (Class E, PD, design codes etc)

- Camden's Cabinet Member is keen to achieve as much coverage in new Class E to residential Article 4 Direction as possible – offices, light industry and retail covering CAZ, Knowledge Quarter and centres. Will need produce before the end of July. In its current Article 4 Direction for the area outside of the CAZ, Camden have identified the offices included rather than having a blanket direction.
- Haringey have an Article 4 for office to residential which is just about to come into effect, covering the Metropolitan Centre and District Centres, so will have to embark on a new one.

- Neither borough is convinced about the value of design codes in much of London. Haringey feel their characterisation study would be starting point.

4. Housing delivery and land supply

- Camden scored 79% in latest HDT so needs a 20% buffer on its five year land supply. Does not have a five year supply so the presumption in favour of sustainable development applies.
- Haringey are marginal on 5YLS and subject to the presumption but this has had little impact on appeal decisions, with Inspector upholding housing mix policies in recent case. It can be difficult to demonstrate that (larger) sites can definitely come forward.
- Haringey estate regeneration has fallen away - large-scale redevelopment is not favoured. Tenants' ballot was successful at Broadwater Farm where the homes were unsuitable for continued use without extensive work.
- Haringey has relooked at Wood Green Mall redevelopment proposals, but still have lots of development sites coming forward in the centre and Cultural Quarter.

Gypsy and Travellers

- Camden has a handful of existing pitches and a needs study from 2014, before 2015 changes to national guidance. That showed a need for 16 additional pitches to 2031, but no need for travelling showpeople plots or transit pitches. Have not yet identified any sites – and are considering steps to take in advance of submission / examination.
- Haringey have appointed ORS to work on a new needs study following the national definition.

First homes and affordable home ownership

- Camden currently promotes intermediate rent rather than shared ownership, and responded to the First Homes consultation indicating that the product was not appropriate in high market value boroughs such as Camden.
- Haringey's priority is social rent.

Other specialist housing including self build

- Haringey now have two entries on the self-build register since establishing financial resources test and fee. Camden position is similar.

5. Neighbourhood Plans

- Haringey officers have not had comments from Highgate NF about possible review of their Plan. HNF did comment on Highgate School SPD (now adopted).
- Finsbury Park/ Stroud Green is a tri-borough forum (with Islington and Hackney).
- Crouch End NF designation expired in December - have applied for re-designation.
- Camden has five made neighbourhood plans following the referendum / adoption of Dartmouth Park NP.
- Camley Street NP referendum will be in May alongside the Mayoral election.
- Redington Froggnal NP referendum will be in mid-June.

- West Kentish Town/Gospel Oak are intending to establish a Forum. Kilburn still intending to produce an NP.

6. Article 4 Directions

- Discussed as per the notes above.

7. Any other cross border strategic matters

- Camden commented on the Highgate School SPD and Haringey made appropriate amendments.
- Highgate School applications are expected soon. There are proposals for a small refurbishment and astroturf pitch adjacent to the Camden boundary.

8. Statement of Common Ground

- Haringey does not have any existing SoCGs.
- Camden does and will share the Camden-Islington SoCG as an example.
- Camden will have to produce / update SoCGs before submission of its Site Allocations Local Plan.

Local Plans

- Haringey are preparing a local plan and looking to take a draft to Cabinet later in the year.
- Have commissioned various evidence including a SINC update, retail study and economic evidence. Intend to commission further viability work.
- Have also a characterisation study, with fine grained assessment.
- Tall buildings work has been in house. Likely to give maximum heights in the Plan.
- Plan will be place based - 11 neighbourhood areas with place policies for each.
- Camden have been preparing a Site Allocations Local Plan which has been twice published for Reg 18 consultation.
- Now commencing preparation of a new Local Plan and will roll site allocations into this.
- Camden is also updating the Euston Local Plan.

Housing

- Haringey are planning to roll forward the London Plan housing target in their Local Plan.
- Have enough sites to (just) meet need.
- Discussed approaches to social housing.
- Haringey are looking to have a 40% affordable housing target.
- Camden are likely to retain a 50% target subject to viability,
- London Gypsies and Travellers Accommodation Needs Assessment ongoing, which will provide evidence for the borough's local plans.
- Camden has an identified need.

Planning reforms (Class E, PD, design codes etc)

- Haringey's character study looked at prevailing typologies. They are not intending to do design codes at this time.
- Camden is also not planning to do design codes.

Any other cross border strategic matters

- Highgate School – being taking forward in line with Haringey's SPD, which Camden commented on.

Local Plans

- Camden carried out Reg 18 consultation on a draft new Local Plan earlier this year
- Key issue included housing, mixed use, affordable housing, affordable workspace, retrofit / retention v demolition
- Aiming for Cabinet on Reg 19 later in the year.
- Camden consulted on a draft of the Euston Area Plan in 2023. Then HS2 work was paused by the government so the Council paused the EAP work given the uncertainty. There is still uncertainty but the plan is now being progressed again. Additional consultation is happening over summer to reflect changing situation
- The EAP review has a similar timeline to the Local Plan review.

- Haringey are aiming to take a Reg 18 Draft Plan to Cabinet by the end of year.
- Plan will not be submitted before the June 2024 deadline.
- A second call for sites just finished
- Will produce a single plan incorporating all AAPs.
- Received evidence back last week that supports 10% affordable workspace from offices and more from industrial, subject to viability, for sites over 1000sqm

Housing

- Camden will have a capacity based housing target post the London Plan period, rather than rolling the London Plan figure forward.
- LBC will be writing to neighbours under to DtC as ask them if they can assist in meeting needs on housing and Gypsies and Travellers accommodation.
- LBH are not in a position to help. They will also have an identified need for Gypsies and Travellers accommodation.
- This will need to be covered in the SoGC.
- LBH think they can meet 10 years of the London Plan target
- Co-living - Islington seems to have tightened approach to this and student homes. Camden will likely give an option for conventional affordable housing student schemes.
- Camden has a small self build list. Only one person is now on Haringey's list.

Other policy matters

- Discussed Camden's mixed use policy.
- Both boroughs are looking at having a retrofit first approach.

- Haringey led the borough net-zero and are looking to introduce embodied carbon targets for new build. Camden are looking at energy targets for re-use / extensions and also new build.

Neighbourhood planning

- Highgate were redesignated a couple of years ago. There is no word they are looking to update their NP.
- Hampstead are updating their plan

Statement of Common Ground

- Will need to update before Camden's Reg 19 consultation

AOB

- Haringey held a workshop last year on their Infrastructure Delivery Plan. They should be able to share a draft in a month or so.

Camden presented an update on their work to date, noting the evolving and confidential nature of some of the inputs to the EAP, the presentation is summarised below.

Update on Euston Area Plan

- LBC recapped on the aims of the EAP and timeline of work since it was adopted in 2015.
- The update to the EAP is being developed alongside work by Lendlease, HS2 and Network Rail to consider how development can come forward in the context of a campus wide approach to Euston.
- Much of the development capacity is on land created by the redevelopment of the stations and tracks. In order to reduce costs and complexity, HS2 Ltd. are seeking to reduce the amount of decking providing resulting in less developable land available particularly for residential development.

Previous consultation

- Reminder of previous consultations took place in 2023 (Regulation 18) and a supplementary “direction of travel” consultation took place in 2024 following Government announcements about Euston and a pause in updating the EAP while awaiting the outcome of the reset to work at Euston.

Changes to EAP strategies

- Camden presented the updated work in progress illustrative diagrams for Principle Strategies and character areas. There is a greater focus on Knowledge economy uses and the amount of homes has reduced due to less enabled land.

Building Heights

- Camden presented where additional height may go and the impact on LVMF and local views. The definition of a tall building has been updated in line with the Local Plan (40 metres in CAZ and 30 metres elsewhere) and additional locations identified for tall buildings including locations on Euston Road.
- Haringey questioned whether the Euston development would go through the Alexandra Palace Viewing Corridor to which Camden confirmed it does not. The Viewing Corridors and associated Wider Setting Consultation Areas of View that effect the Euston development are 5A.2 and 6A.1 (5A.2 Greenwich Park: the General Wolfe Statue – looking toward St. Paul's Cathedral and 6A.1 Blackheath Point: near the orientation board - looking toward St. Paul's Cathedral).

Viability

- Camden set out that the viability assessment concentrates on the station where there are extraordinary costs, relying on Local Plan assessment for non-station sites.

Next steps

- Cabinet decision on submission draft programmed for November 2025 with Reg 19 submission draft consultation in December 2025
- Agreed to update Statement of Common Ground as necessary
- Camden offered another meeting if needed.
- Haringey confirmed that another meeting was not required.

Notes shared following the meeting summarised briefly the strategic and non-strategic issues discussed. The Euston Team can confirm that the Alexandra Palace to Central London View (1A.2) does not cross Euston station.

Update on Local Plans

Haringey

- Reg 18 Local Plan is due to go to Cabinet in September with consultation to follow. Includes site allocations but no major development is envisaged near to Camden. There are some modest proposals around Highgate.
- Planning to roll forward their current London Plan figure as it will be replaced by a new London Plan target before their Plan is adopted.

Camden

- Reg 19 consultation closed in June. Large number of comments on a Travellers site. Aiming to submit in the autumn, with examination hearings in the new year.
- Have capacity based housing figure beyond current the London Plan target period. The GLA have raised conformity objection.
- Euston Area Plan - Haringey met the Euston Team about it last week.

Housing delivery and land supply

- Both boroughs have had lots of applications for student and co-living rather than C3 housing.
- Both have policy covering student homes. The emerging Haringey local plan has policy approach to co-living. Camden relies on London Plan.

Gypsies and Travellers accommodation

- Camden wrote to Haringey and all boroughs asking if they could assist meeting Gypsy and Traveller needs and 5 year land supply. Haringey have not replied. Can cover as part of Statement of Common Ground.
- Boroughs will exchange information about charges for Gypsies and Travellers pitch fees.

Neighbourhood Plans

- Highgate NF are waiting on the boroughs' Local Plans before deciding about updating their plan. They submitted a response to the Reg 19 Camden Local Plan.
- Camden will shortly be adopting a revised Hampstead NP. Kilburn NP examination is about to start. Somers Town are restarting work on their plan.

Strategic Infrastructure requirements

- Camden - draft IDP published at Reg 19 stage. Now updating for submission.
- Haringey have a digital interactive IDP - won in the Planning awards
- No cross boundary infrastructure issues identified.

Any other cross border strategic matters

- All boroughs have received a letter from Tower Hamlets about assisting with their waste needs. Neither borough has responded yet. Islington have.
- Camden received a local plan representation proposing a new strategic view of St Paul's Cathedral from Waterlow Park, which is adjacent to Haringey. Will forward. Strategic views are a London Plan issue.
